Financial Aid Eligibility.

Financial aid is available to students who are U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or DACA recipients. Students must be enrolled in a degree program and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0. For more information, contact the Financial Aid Office at (919) 919-8522.

Citizenship Requirements for Federal and State Aid.

1. A U.S. citizen.
2. A U.S. permanent resident (Green Card holder).
3. A DACA recipient (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals).

Non-U.S. Citizens Who Qualify for Federal and State Aid.

Non-U.S. citizens who are permanent residents or DACA recipients may be eligible for federal and state financial aid. Contact the Financial Aid Office for details.

Non-citizen Eligibility.

1. A U.S. citizen or permanent resident (born in the U.S., born with U.S. citizenship, or naturalized U.S. citizen).
2. A U.S. permanent resident (Green Card holder) or DACA recipient. (BC - Birth Certificate, CA - Certificate of Arrival, PA - Permanent Resident Card, CA - Certificate of Arrival, [Citizenship Act (1980)]).
3. A U.S. citizen or permanent resident who is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident by birth, naturalization, or adoption.

Note: A U.S. citizen or permanent resident (born in the U.S.) is eligible for federal and state financial aid.

U.S. citizens and permanent residents (born in the U.S., born with U.S. citizenship, or naturalized U.S. citizen) are eligible for federal and state financial aid. Contact the Financial Aid Office for more information.

Class Loads and Financial Aid.

Financial aid is based on the number of credit hours a student is enrolled in each semester. Students enrolled in 12-15 credit hours receive a higher percentage of aid (50% to 75%) compared to those enrolled in 6-9 credit hours. Contact the Financial Aid Office for more information.

Financial Aid Options.

Financial aid options include grants, scholarships, and student loans. Grants and scholarships do not need to be repaid, while student loans must be repaid. Contact the Financial Aid Office for more information.
