How much time should I expect to be online with taking aclass?

The classes will vary based on the professor how they have chosen to sup the class The syllabus will be the best way to learn when and how often you will need to be on scheduled online chats or assignments. The online classes are created with a busy home and work schedule in mind.

Most classes require out o view recorded lectures, of online researchand complete specifice ading assignments. Occasional scheduled group chats or online sessions are scheduled and the telds syllabus and/or Learning Hub class sess from will then need to schedule yourself to meet the assignment deadlines and exam schedules. Questions can always be forwarded to the class facilitator who is assigned to assist the professor and the student in any given class.

How do I register for classes?

You will register for classes via the Andrews systemiled "Registration Central (Tutorial is provided in the Online Studen Drientation class.) Your Academic Advisor will send you a list of classes by step instructions for registration every semester.

- x Find your class alphabetically on the listliekon "Syllabus" far right of the listings. You will need to submit your username and password in order to receive a PDF copy of the syllabus. If one is not provided, emaile professor of record. An automatic email can be sent by clicking on their name, which is also provided on the list of classes.
- x Syllabus will list books/textbooks required class expectations.

When/how do I decide if I will do a thesis/project/or comprehensive exams?

Students decide which final capstone projetely wish to complete. It is usually determined by your future goals. Students wanting topply forfuture doctoral degreeare encouraged to do a thesis. However, if you are planning go into a professional ministry arena rather than an academic environment, you may want to choose a Research Projects your final capstone Comprehensive Exams are usually selectedly students whoare not interested in pursuing degrees past the master level. Your Academic Advisor will have a conversation with you regarding your future plans and help you do decide what is best. It is recommended that you select your final capstone project during the first semester in the program. This will help determine which classes you should take in the future.
